Based on the recommendation of the hiring taskforce, Council approved the hiring of two new music staff persons - Kristopher and Emily Hartman! Emily will be the primary organist, and they will serve together to lead the choirs, bells, children's ensembles and overall music ministry here at Grace. You may already know both of these talented musicians because they led us "up front" through the pandemic- Emily serves as Cantor, and Kristopher is often on trumpet. Both use their gifts to teach music to middle schoolers during the week.

UPDATE FROM THE CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL

Paster Beth Martini from the Synod introduced Pastor Van Orden, who is trained in intentional interim ministry. Council voted to contract with interim pastor Lois Van Orden from June 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023.

Pastor Cover had submitted a written exit evaluation and she went over some of the highlights of her report in her exit interview.

Council approved renewing the current lease at 1604 Carlisle Road for another year and to install two electrical outlets – one in the garage and one outside.

We are still seeking two Grace members to represent the congregation at Synod assembly on Friday, June 3 and Saturday, June 4. The Day of edification on May 14 should also be attended by Synod Assembly delegates . Both events will be held online.

Council is also seeking at least four potential candidates to serve on council for the next three-year term which will begin July 1, 2022 and will be voted upon at the June Congregational meeting.

The Congregational meeting has been scheduled for June 26·2022.

Did You Know....

May 1 is Lei Day in Hawaii. Leis are garlands or wreaths that are often made with native Hawaiian flowers and leaves. Nowadays, they are given as a symbol of greeting, farewell, affection, celebration, or honor, in the spirit of aloha. Lei Day originated in 1927, when poet Don Blanding proposed a holiday to recognize the lei's role in Hawaiian culture. Writer Grace Tower Warren suggested May 1 for the date because it coincided with May Day, a celebration also linked to flowers. She coined the phrase, "May Day is Lei Day." The first Lei Day observance occurred on May 1, 1928. The following year, it was made an official holiday in the territory. (Hawaii did not become a state until 1959.)

May is a special time for Star Wars fans worldwide and always a good reason to re-watch the movies. May the 4th is celebrated as Star Wars day, due to the way the date sounds similar to "May the Force."

INTERCESSORY PRAYER UPDATE

It is with great reluctance that I am writing this note. After 54 years, I can no longer handle all that is needed to keep the prayer ministry going. I hope fervently that someone can take over this important ministry.

The first thing I want to do is to thank all the volunteer prayers who have been praying and keeping the ministry going for all these years. Without you, this ministry could never have happened.

Here is a little history about the prayer ministry. The prayer list started in 1968 when the Koinonia groups from Grace church were meeting. Each Koinonia group did a lot of study on the Bible, their faith, and religion. About 10 people were in each group, and the group members prayed for each other every day as part of the program. We decided we would take prayer requests from anybody who needed prayers. At that time there were three lists with about ten people on each list. We realized we needed to have a little more organization, so we started sending out a prayer list to people who volunteered to pray for others for any need they may have. I took over maintaining the list, and the prayer ministry began.

In the beginning we had two or three lists with about ten names on each. A different team of prayers took responsibility for praying for the individuals on each list. We selected a leader for each prayer team. As people with new needs were identified, I would add their names to the

list. In the beginning, I used a manual typewriter to maintain the list! I sent a copy of the list to each group leader, who would then copy it by hand and send it to the members of their team. That initial list has now grown to well over 200 names and 15 prayer teams. Over time, we added universal prayers to each list for our pastor, the church itself, and world peace. I no longer use a typewriter, but maintain the list on my computer (with some technical help!). With the help of the staff in the church office, I make copies at church so that the prayer captains no longer have to. In addition to the prayer list, we held a healing service once a month in Barclay Chapel. Often the service would be led by a pastor from another church. After each service, we would meet to have coffee and refreshments and to answer any questions people might have or to share thoughts on the service.

Throughout the existence of the prayer list, we have been careful to protect the privacy and dignity of those for whom prayers were given, listing only the first name and last initial of each individual. People have asked "how can I pray for someone if I don't know what they need or what I'm praying about?" I told them to put everything into God's hands. God knows what each of us really needs physically, mentally, spiritually, and in every other way. This answer provided relief and comfort for our prayers.

Due to the COVID pandemic, our list has not been updated since January 2019. At that time, I could no longer go to the church to have the list duplicated, and now my own health prevents me from updating and maintaining the list. We continue to add names to the list as we become aware of needs, but otherwise the list has remained constant.

I hope that someone will be able to take over the maintenance of the prayer list. A younger person with better computer skills will probably find it is not difficult to maintain. If anybody is interested in continuing this ministry, I will gladly offer you my experience and my thoughts to help make a successful transition. This ministry has been an important part of my life and important to the prayer teams and the people being prayed for, and I hope it can continue under new leadership. I believe in the power of prayer. I think prayer benefits the person being prayed for by knowing that others care, and it benefits the person praying as they think good thoughts for others. I hope that everyone will continue to pray for the people whose names that are printed weekly in the Grace News.

GETTING RID OF 'ALL THE CRAP'

And Jesus said to them, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." -Luke 12:

The father of small children was commiserating about how hard it is to keep the house clean with energetic, active, creative kids at home. "What really gets to me about cleaning the house," he said, "is all the crap."

Crap. Not just the toys and stuffed animals that overflow from toy bins, under beds and closets. The adult stuff, too – the gadgets crowding the kitchen, the cleaning products jammed under the sink, the stuff crammed in the medicine cabinet, the yard junk all over the lawn, and on and on.

The crap factor comes to mind in Jesus' parable of "the rich fool" in Luke 12:17-20. The fool has so much stuff, he wants bigger barns to hold it all. The parable should strike a chord with us in America, where accumulation is such a big problem that self-storage (our "bigger barns") is booming business.

A man of few possessions, Jesus kept everything simple. He must have known how hard it is to focus on godly living when our lives are cluttered with stuff. Of course, Jesus' parable talks about possessions, but the same principle applies to the mind and heart's clutter of ideas, loyalties and desires that distract us from God.

How cluttered is your house? Your mind? Your soul?

For the month of May, consider a house cleaning to get rid of unneeded, unnecessary stuff. And prayerfully consider what "clutter" may be in your mind, heart and soul as well. What needs to be tossed out, recycled or donated in order that your house and your spirit can focus on what's truly important? That is, the things of God.


