April 17, 2022 (Easter Sunday)

Luke 24:9, 11 –And returning from the tomb, [Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women] told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them.

The Gospel today can still seem like an "idle tale" for people outside the church. But like the women who found the tomb empty, we can only tell what we know and invite people to see Jesus for themselves.

AN EASTER MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

We are delighted you are here with us on this festival day! If you are visiting with us this Easter morning, a special welcome to you! Read on in this weekly newsletter about some things we are up to right now, as well as our typical weekend worship schedule.

Today we have a special guest with us, from long ago. She will tell us of the things that have been taking place these last few days – in her time, as well as ours. Jesus, who once was dead, is now alive again. How

does she know that? She heard Jesus call her name in that garden outside the tomb. Today we are reminded that Jesus calls us all by name, knows everything about us, and loves us *anyway*. Jesus calls us all by name, and welcomes us to the table of eternal life. Jesus will call all our loved ones by name again—those who have died—when he tells them to “rise up!” at the resurrection. Jesus will call our own names one day as well, when he greets us

in the garden, outside our own tombs. Today our special guest reminds us: death is not the end of our story; resurrection is.

This morning, may you hear that truth most of all – in the singing, in the preaching, in the sharing of a holy meal. Most of all: may you hear the voice of the Risen Christ, standing among you, calling your name.

EASTER STEWARDSHIP: RESURRECTION RESET

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. -Romans 6:3-4

Christ is Risen! Risen, indeed! Alleluia!

The triumphant words we cherish every Easter signal more than just Jesus' victory over the grave. They announce for us the end of deadness and the start of a new life, a fresh beginning, in our earthly pilgrimage. Jesus was raised from the dead so that we, too, might walk in newness of life.

From Jesus' resurrection, our lives take on a new trajectory, a turn away from the values and precepts of the world and toward the kingdom of God. As we journey, our lives progressively align with the purposes and mission of God.

For a steward-disciple of our Lord, the implications are many. As we walk in newness of life, we might find ourselves

+ Re-examining our relationship to “stuff” – our money, our possessions, the things that might have given us a sense of security or worth. Jesus is our security and our worth.

+ Drawing closer to family and friends. True wealth is measured by the love we give and receive. Our lives

effervesce with the love we receive from God.

+ Contributing more to church and charity. Jesus frees us from the grip that possessions have upon us. We can more freely give.
+ Gathering into our lives what Paul calls the fruits of the spirit. “Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control” (Galatians 5:22-23).

May your lives as steward-disciples take a resurrection reset. Christ is risen! Risen indeed! Alleluia!

FROM THE PASTOR

Something surprising I learned in my workshop on "leaving well" - 80% of clergy leave within 2 years of a capital campaign or other large project. They pointed us to articles listing items- positive as well as negative- that can exhaust a pastor. I went through the list and could check nearly every box! (Capital campaign, adding worship service, staff changes, ...a pandemic...). That didn't even include the list they had for personal stressors: changes in health, birth of a child, death of a significant family member, etc. I had all those also. So: nine years was a long time considering!! Maybe you feel it was a short ministry, but based on all those clergy photos hanging in the library, it was the longest ministry since Pastor Mueller! That was 2001! (He and I talked about this!) Also in the workshop, we were asked to think of any pastors we knew who stepped down from ministry, but kept good boundaries. I instantly thought of Dr. McCarney - a great model of leaving well, and he did it while remaining a member of the congregation (because he had retired from ministry). He had excellent boundaries - he wouldn't do pastoral acts, even if I asked him to please help me with a funeral! What a great model you have already had in "leaving well."
